As we prepare for the 2025 cricket season, the Club would like to extend sincere thanks to Richard Waddell and George Bunn for stepping up to lead during a time of significant change. Richard has been elected Club Captain, overseeing all senior playing matters while George has stepped in as 1st Team Captain to take on the challenge of trying to keep us in Alliance Division 1



Richard joined Great Melton in 2011 when he moved down from his native Newcastle and has 5 years' experience as 1st Team Captain, incuding leading the team to promotion in 2013 and again in 2019. Richard has played 182 times for the club, taking 226 wickets and scoring 2239 runs.

Following two remarkable seasons of unprecedented success, we now find ourselves entering a new chapter. While we had anticipated the potential departure of one or two players aiming to test themselves at a higher level, we weren't expecting quite the scale of change — with six players moving on.

That said, we see this not as a setback but as a fresh opportunity. Competing in Alliance Division 1 without last season's top four batsmen will present a challenge, and there will naturally be a ripple effect across all four of our Saturday teams. But as we've learned from over 50 years of proud Club history, every sporting journey includes its highs and lows — and it's during these transitional moments that character and community shine brightest.

Winter Success

NORFOLK CHAMPIONS

THE MEN'S TEAM capped a fine indoor season for the club by being crowned Norfolk champions. A youthful team, including a trio of McKays, ensured a top-place finish in our South Norfolk group with a final-game win against Dereham before further victories over Drayton and Hethersett & Tas Valley on S.N. Finals' Day secured the winners medals and a place in the County final on Sunday 23rd March. A composed batting performance aand victory over Mundford in the semi-final was followed by a very close final against North Norfolk winners, Bradfield. Having won the toss skipper Martyn Cook elected to



field first but Melton found wickets hard to come by and Bradfield posted a very respectable 269. However, another good batting display from all 3 pairs saw Melton crowned Norfolk champions for the 2nd time, having initially won the trophy in 2023.

IMPORTANT PLEASE REGISTER YOUR OWN PLAY-CRICKET ACCOUNT

We've all become used to the 'Play-Cricket' website and, with the advent of live-scoring, the Great Melton one is our first point of call when we're trying to follow the progress of our teams, find our results or see who the star players were in any given week. It is also used by the leagues for registrations and transfers. All our players, senior and junior, have to be registered on Play-Cricket and it's important that personal details, like names and dates of birth are correct, or problems can arise. In the past club administrators have been able to set up/amend accounts for players but now, club members have to do this for themselves. It is important, therefore, that you check your own and your children's Play-Cricket accounts and edit them as appropriate. If you don't have one, please create one. Go to https://greatmelton.play-cricket.com/home. If you already have an account, log-in & go to Account/Edit Account. To register for the first time select 'Sign-Up' at the top of any Play-Cricket site and follow the instructions.

TEAMS & COACHES 2025

Having won 4 County Cup competitions and reached the final of 2 others in 2023 it would have been extremely difficult to emulate those achievements in 2024 but our youngsters were still pretty impressive. The U15 Phoenix team won the Andy Seeley Cup, the U13 Phoenix won the ECB Cup (Norfolk) & were runners-up in the Regional Final while all the other age group teams reached the semi-finals of their county competitions. We also succeeded in our aim to provide competitive cricket for as many youngsters as possible by fielding several Blaze and Fire teams in the 2nd tier of the Alliance competions. The U11 Fire team actually did brilliantly to win their league.

In **2025** the club will field 11 hardball teams across 6 age groups from U9s to U19s.

U9s: 1 hardball team & 1 softball team (tbc). Lead Coach: lain Nichols.

U11s: 3 hardball teams (Phoenix, Blaze & Fire). Lead Coach: Joel Pailes

U13s: 3 hardball teams (Phoenix, Blaze & Fire). 1 Blaze/Fire Team will be an **U13 Girls' Team**. Lead Coach: Gary Coleman

U15s: 2 teams (Phoenix & Blaze). Lead Coaches: Chris McKay & Oli Berney

SUMMER TRAINING/COACHING

Friday night training starts on Friday 25th April (6.30-8.00 p.m.) for U9s and U11s.

Monday night training for U13s & U15s starts on Monday 28th April (6.30-8.00 p.m.).

Girls in school years 8 & above (plus any County Year 7s) are also invited to attend the **Ladies**' sessions (in addition to their normal Monday sessions). These are likely to start on **Thursday 1st May (6.30-8.00 p.m.)** tbc.

All Stars & **Dvnamos** courses are aimed at children who are brand new to cricket or too young to join our hardball sessions. Registration is open now & is managed by the ECB and not by the club. sessions start on Friday 16 May and run for 8 weeks until 4th July.

All Stars is for youngsters from Reception to Year 2 and will run from 5.45-6.30. The coaches will be Helen Aston, Rob Pugh, Matt Gilbert & Steve Cadge.

Dynamos is aimed at youngsters in Years 3-6 and will be from 6.45-7.45 p.m. The coaches are Bron Nicholls and Rob Pugh.

WOMEN & GIRLS CRICKET 2025

Melton & Swardeston Join Forces



Great Melton & Swardeston Cricket Clubs are excited to announce the merging of their ladies' teams to compete in the newly formed Iceni Women's League Division 1 and the existing Women's Shell and Softball Leagues for the 2025 season onwards. Both clubs see the merger as a fantastic opportunity that will give players the ability to play at the most appropriate level and help to develop their

cricket by having a clear pathway. It should also ensure a wider pool of talent to enable competitive teams to be fielded in each level of competition.

With twice the number of coaches, opportunities to train on alternative Monday and Thursday evenings and both Melton Park and Saxlingham available for matches and training, this is a a big step forward for ladies' cricket at both clubs.

The merger, however, only impacts the Women's teams (involving women & girs from Year 8 upwards plus Year 7 County squad girls) and will not affect other junior or senior cricket that will continue to be managed and organised separately.

Work is underway regarding playing kit, shirt sponsorship and membership details but here's a sneak-peak at a possible new logo (still to be ratified)



OUR YOUNGER GIRLS



Our 'ladies' team (pictured left V Swardeston at Saxlingham last season) is quite a young one and many of our female players compete on an equal footing with the boys, representing our Phoenix, Blaze or Fire teams. An U13 girls' Blaze/Fire team will compete against 'mixed-sex' teams in tier 2 of the NCA competition in 2025. In addition there are opportunities to enter various women & girls softball tournaments during the season so there will be plenty of cricket for girls of all ages and abilities. Some of our older girls like Alice Brand, Rebecca Davey & Niamh Rushton have been playing senior league cricket for several years. Last year Niamh was selected for our A Team in Division 3 of the NCA.

Membership and Match Fees

2025 registration and membership subscriptions will be requested in the next few weeks via Spond. Registrations need to be completed and subscriptions paid before the 1st May. The fees have increased a bit this year but are still very good value compared to most clubs. They are:

- Senior players (Year 11 and above): £40 membership fee; £7 match fee; £3.50 midweek match fee
- Students and unemployed: £20 membership fee; £3.50 match fee/midweek match fee
- Junior players (Years 3-10): £60 membership, training/coaching fee; £3.50 match fee (all matches)
- Social/Non-Playing Membership: £10

Spond will continue to be used for the collection of match fees. It costs a lot to run a club the size of Great Melton so all senior players & parents of juniors are asked to pay promptly when requested on the Spond app. It saves us having to 'chase up' lots of debtors at the end of the season. If there are any problems or any specific hardship, please speak to the team captain, manager or lead coach. The Club will consider any requests sensitively and sympathetically.

PAVILION PLANS



With the finishing touches applied to the pavilion and having had a bit of a rest from 'projects' we're now looking at what further improvements could be made. curtains have certainly made the clubroom less noisy but a rug and some new sofas will, hopefully, make it even better. Some 'landscaping' is needed around the entrance and the original plans also had a 'phase 2' which included possible solar panels and an updated hot water system. During the winter the present tank in the roof leaked and caused a bit of damage to the ceiling but thanks to our plumber Matt Clarke's swift action it was quicky repaired and the staining on the ceiling will be rectified on 'Get Set Day'.

Any further work will be dependent on grants and Joel Pailes has kindly offered to apply on our behalf to the Hornsea 3 Community Fund.

There are already plans to install wifi and Steve Clarke has offered to take over the management of the bar stock. We're hoping for a few more volunteers who might be prepared to 'do a stint' behind the bar on a Friday evening (and at other times) so the onus doesn't always fall on the same people like Matt or Duncan (pictured below). If you would like to help, please speak to Steve or one of the present bar staff. Having wifi should make things much easier.


